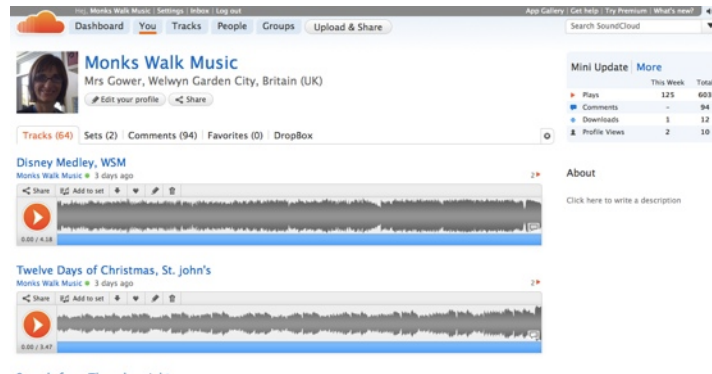


## Online assessment and feedback

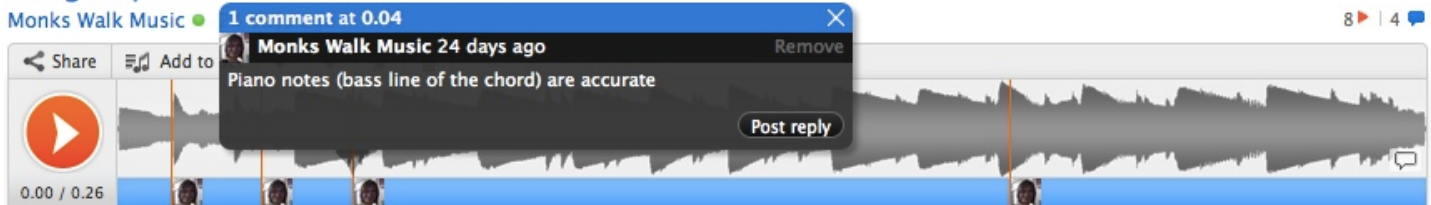

1. Download the 'Soundcloud' app to your mobile phone and create an account at [www.soundcloud.com](http://www.soundcloud.com) You need a 3g or wireless connection to use this

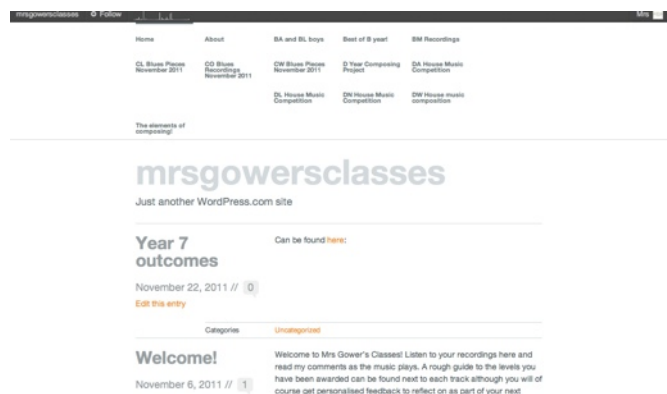


2. Sign into the app using your account details. Check that you are not linked to Twitter or Facebook if your school ICT policy doesn't permit this
3. When you record you will be given the option to save and upload, giving the track a title and tagging your location if you wish. This will upload directly to your account online. If you are recording groups in practice rooms, by the time they get back to the classroom you should be able to play it straight back to them
4. Using the comment feature, add your feedback on the track. These comments will flash up as the track plays back

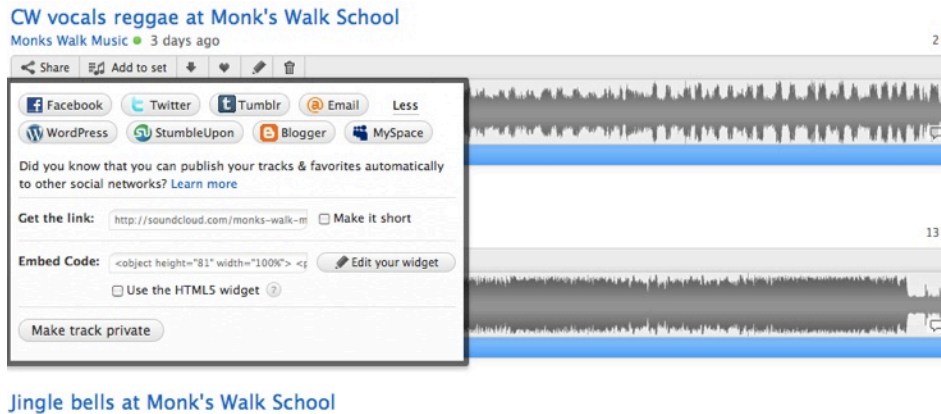

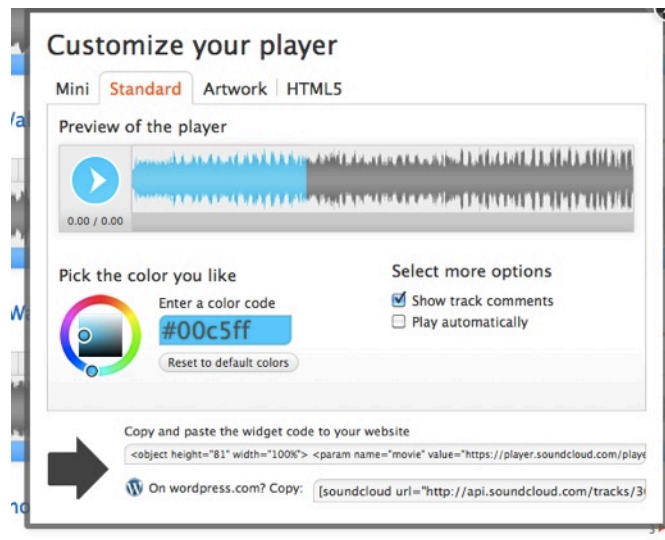
5. Create a free blog using word press.com, blogger or similar



6. On your Soundcloud file, click the share button and you will find an embed code or a link. Copy and paste this code to your blog making sure you have clicked the HTML button on the blog



7. You may need to click the 'edit your widget' button to find the correct code for Wordpress.com, play around until you get it to work!



8. Once you have embedded your files, any changes you make on Soundcloud will also copy over to the web page. Add your comments above or below each track as appropriate. Publish or save your webpage and give students the link, either via the school VLE or using the short code, QR code or other!
